Italy Needs Jesus



atrizia was an adult, but in a way she felt like a child. She felt lost, confused and alone in her search for answers to the questions in her heart. Questions about God. Her friends wanted to talk only about soccer or movies or music.

"Where can I find the truth about God?" Patrizia wondered.

One day she met a World Team missionary and soon began reading the Bible with her.

"I felt like a lost sheep all these years and finally God has answered my prayers. Now there is someone to help me understand the Bible and God's will for my life."

She will tell you that Italy needs more missionaries! Do you wonder how that can be? Italy is a modern country in Europe. They already know the gospel, right? No, they don't.



Most people in Italy don't know the true gospel, and don't care. They think they know about God, but the religion of their culture does not tell the truth about what Jesus did for us.

Most people have never decided to believe in Jesus and live for him. In fact, more and more young people are moving toward not believing in God. They don't see anything real in the religion of their culture. The religion they see seems hollow. It doesn't connect to their daily life.

Cathedrals, which are large church buildings, are almost empty of people. At the same time, more mosques are being built for the large number of Muslim immigrants.

World Team missionaries invite people to small groups to learn about Jesus. Then, the new followers of Jesus are the start of new churches. This is called church planting.


How do missionaries start these small groups? In the northern city of Milan, missionaries make ways to talk to people about the gospel in many places. They do park outreach events, art exhibitions, and children's programs.

One small group of true followers of Jesus began to meet a few years ago. This small group always talks to their friends and neighbors about the gospel. This is how the good news about Jesus spreads.



Paul wanted the Gentiles in Italy to hear the Good News about Jesus.




