Use What You Know

What do you want to be when you grow up? A farmer? A business owner? A chef, teacher, or nurse? Something else?

Did you know you can be a missionary-farmer, a missionary-chef, or a missionary-anything else? In fact, in countries in Central Asia, you cannot go as a missionary unless you are a person who does another job too.

That is a wonderful thing because while you cook, or sell stuff, or make stuff, or grow stuff, or teach, or be a doctor or nurse, or whatever you do, you will make friends. Friends who don't know Jesus. They learn to trust you and you can have talks with them about Jesus and salvation.

Take Jake and Darcy, for instance.

When someone told them that they could be missionaries, they were surprised. Jake was an engineer and Darcy was a submarine officer. Could God use those skills to help spread the Gospel?

Yes! He can use any skill we have. They joined a mission group then

told friends and other church people about their plans to go to Central Asia. Friends and churches gave money so that Jake and Darcy could go and could live in the Central Asian country they chose.

In Central Asia, most people don't know the real God. Some don't believe in God at all, and many have never heard about Jesus.

But almost all of them enjoy making friends. How could Jake and Darcy make friends? A good way was learning how to say, "Hi. I'm here to practice your language." and then went somewhere else to practice. The next day they learned and practiced more things to say or things to ask. They liked to practice at the market or other places where people were.



Some missionaries in Central Asia are allowed to live there because they teach things like better ways to grow vegetables or animals, to help farmers make a better living.

Other missionaries teach people how to start small businesses so they can

Pray for new mission workers to quickly get used to living in Central Asia.

Pray that they will soon learn the local language, culture, and how to live in their new country. Pray that

they can quickly make friends. support their families – businesses like little restaurants or sewing shops or other things.

Or maybe you could become a student in a college there, and get to know people that way.

Or be an English teacher. Whatever you want to be, you can be it in Central Asia.

Russian Orthodox and Islam are the large religions in Central Asia. The people often do not trust the missionaries at first.

However, Central Asians are also friendly and love to have guests, even strangers, join them to eat. Most homes have something handy to offer you if you visit. Even if you didn't let them know you were coming or are a stranger, they can quickly pull out dried fruit, nuts, and nan (local bread) to serve with hot tea to anyone who shows up.

Sometimes a Muslim is also happy to talk about religion with a guest. They are curious about what the Bible says about Jesus compared to what Islam says. Over time and many visits, as you show them that you are truly a friend who cares about their best, they will begin to trust you. Then they may ask you questions about Jesus, and you can slowly help them to understand the truth about Him.

To do that clearly, you must learn the local language. Depending on where you are, you have to learn either Russian, Uzbek, Kyrgyz, or Tajik.

Remember what we said about practicing the local language in the market and other city places? You can also practice in the wide open areas in Central Asia, including in the mountains.



Maybe Jesus wants you to live on a cold mountain and learn to talk with a family there about Jesus.

Whatever language you learn, make it fun! And do it for Jesus. ◆
