What is this field/ministry?

World Team has been serving in Cambodia for 25 years. There are currently 35 World Team workers in various locations throughout the country. In Battambang, six WT missionaries Cambodian staff facilitate and lead the ministries. The ministry Roots of Grace was founded in 2015 with the vision to: "Introduce Jesus into broken situations with the hope changing generations." There are now 25 unique sites/ministries taking different approaches with that goal in mind.

Ministries include caring for and supporting the education of preschool, elementary, and high school students, empowering women through literacy, vocational training, adult Bible studies, and dorm ministry. In all of these areas, the goal is to love our community and introduce them to Jesus.

What is this Trip?

All interns will be immersed in Cambodian culture and see what full-time ministry in this context looks like.

What will I do?

- Assist with teaching English
- Help with a local children's ministry
- Provide assistance in remedial learning and vocational training
- Participate in Bible studies
- Help with administrative tasks

You will also have some basic language learning while in-country. There are many opportunities to be involved in ministry. Regular activities while on the trip will include participation in daily devotions, daily interactions with our Khmer staff, and gathering with the church.

Eligibility

Candidates should be Christians with an interest in cross-cultural ministry and have at least one year of post-high school study. Qualities such as flexibility and humility are vital to cross-cultural life and ministry. You will need open eyes, a servant heart, and the courage to engage with people from cultures other than your own.
