What is this trip?

Compass uses a "just-in-time" training model. As you learn from experienced workers, you will have opportunities to put what you are learning into practice. We believe that truelearning takes place as you experience the joys and challenges of implementing ministry strategies. Every step of the way, your mentor will be there to help guide you.

Eligibility

Candidates should be Christians with an interest in cross-cultural ministry and have at least one year of post-high school study. Qualities such as flexibility and humility are vital to cross-cultural life and ministry. You will need open eyes, a servant heart, and the courage to engage with people from cultures other than your own.
