you like to visit a missionary face-to-face where they are, see what they do,

and help them? Help them teach the local people more about Jesus? Or maybe help paint a building for them, or help in other ways? Learn enough of the local language to say "Hi. How are you?" You wouldn't stay a long time, but long enough to be a help. Does that sound like something you would like to do? You can! It is called a short term mission trip.

Keep in mind that a short term mission trip means doing real things for Jesus, usually with the missionaries who are there. It is not a trip to just pass out booklets about Jesus

then spend most of the rest of the time hiking or swimming or seeing stuff. You are not a tourist. You are learning and doing what a missionary does.

That is what Ashley did one summer. Ashley was 25 and a nurse. You might be younger when you go, but her story will show you what a real Mission Trip should be. You might do totally different things from what Ashley did, but like her, you will do real things to show Jesus' love - and learn more about His love for you.



Ashley's short-term mission trip started on a big boat. Not a cruise ship kind of boat. It was a boat that takes people to places where they can help missionaries who live there. For Ashley, the place was Papua New Guinea.

Where is that? Find Australia on a map, or world

globe, then look right above it. The right-hand half of the island above Australia is Papua New Guinea.



It is a country with 839 different language groups, the most languages of any country in the world. The different groups talk to

each other i called Tok F

Ashley learned a little Tok Pisin as

she and her fellow short-term workers went from village to village - lots and lots of villages. Sometimes they stayed overnight in a village and slept in open tents using sleeping bags on

To get from village to village, the team rode in trucks that bounced along on rocky and muddy roads, sometimes for many hours.



One time, when their work was done, and they had to wait a long time for their truck, they played in the ocean with the children there.

Ashley is a nurse, so while team-mates did other things, she helped the people who came to her table for bug bite and skin sore treatment, and for babies with tummy aches



and other things. Ashley couldn't help with big problems, and there was no hospital, but she did what she could. For example, Ashley tried to teach the mothers about keeping their children as clean as they could. Ashley learned things from the people there, too, like what plants the village people used for sores or sickness.

Ashley learned that Papua New Guinea was unsafe in many areas, and driving on those dirt roads was often unsafe, too.

Even though she was with other people who could help her, the most important thing Ashley learned was to trust God in a new way. She said, "We had to trust His power and protection so we could do His work."

Each of Papua New Guinea's tribes have their own language. That adds up to almost 850 native languages. That is more than any other nation in the world.






Many of the tribes in Papua New Guinea live in the mountains in the center of the island, and have little contact with anyone else. They gather food from the forests and from their own gardens.
